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## NEW RULES PROPOSED

The Board voted unanimously at the July 19-20, 2001, Board Meeting to propose rule changes this legislative session. A public hearing to discuss the proposed changes will be held on November 29, 2001, at 3:00 p.m. at the Oklahoma Engineering Center, 201 N.E. 27th St., Oklahoma City. You may submit written comments to the Board office and/or attend the public meeting to make oral comments. If you plan to attend, please contact the Board office so that we may arrange for sufficient seating.

Many of the proposed changes are "clean-up" language or clarifications of rules already in place. The most substantive rule changes proposed are Chapter 15, Subchapter 11, which will require professional engineers to show proof of continuing education with their biennial renewal beginning in July of 2004; and Chapter 15, Subchapter 3, Section 7, which will allow a professional engineer applicant who is currently employed as the dean, assistant or associate dean, department head, professor, or assistant or associate professor in the engineering or technology department of an Oklahoma university with an ABET EAC/TAC accredited program, and has a PhD in engineering, to waive the Fundamentals of Engineering Examination and take the Principles and Practice of Engineering Examination as a requirement for registration. This provision in Subchapter 3 will expire December 31, 2005.

In 1992, the legislature enacted statutory language giving the Board the authority to promulgate rules to require professional engineers and professional land surveyors to show proof of continuing education. The Board chose at that time to only promulgate rules for continuing education for professional land surveyors. This decision was based partly on the fact that very few states had initiated continuing education requirements for professional engineers at that time and there appeared to be more of a need for this requirement for land surveyors. Since that time, many states have adopted continuing education requirements for professional engineers and professional land surveyors. To facilitate reciprocity for engineers and surveyors, the Board agreed to draft the proposed language for the rule very similarly to the NCEES Model Law and Rules pertaining to continuing education.



**Proposed Rule Changes:**

**245:15-3-7. Qualifications for engineer registration**

- ....
- (H) Applicants for engineer registration with the following qualifications may waive the fundamentals of engineering (FE) exam and sit for an eight (8) hour written examination in the principles and practice of engineering (PE) to be considered for registration:
- (a) currently employed as the dean, assistant or associate dean, department head, professor, or assistant or associate professor in the engineering or technology department of an ABET EAC/TAC accredited program at a university in the state of Oklahoma; and
  - (b) have the educational requirements as described in OAC 245:15-3-7(2)(A) or (B) followed by a Ph.D. in engineering; and
  - (c) have an additional four (4) years of acceptable engineering experience following the Ph.D. if meeting the educational requirement of OAC 245:15-3-7(2)(A) or an additional six (6) years of acceptable engineering experience following the Ph.D. if meeting the educational requirement of OAC 245:15-3-7(2)(B) is met.

Provided, however, after December 31, 2005, all applicants whether by a first or resubmitted application shall be required to take and pass the FE and PE examination as a qualification for registration as a professional engineer.

**245:15-11-5. Requirements for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors**

(a) To demonstrate that a Professional Engineer and/or Land Surveyor maintains an acceptable level of competency, a registrant must obtain thirty (30) PDH units for a twenty-four month (Biennial) renewal period. If a registrant exceeds the requirement in any Biennial renewal period, a maximum of fifteen (15) ~~PDH's~~ PDH units may be carried forward into the subsequent Biennial renewal period. ~~PDH's~~ PDH units may be earned by a registrant as follows:

- (1) Successful completion or auditing of college courses.
- (2) Successful completion or auditing of continuing education courses.
- (3) Attending seminars, correspondence, televised, videotaped, and other short courses/tutorials.
- (4) ~~Active participation in seminars, in-house courses, workshops, and Professional/Technical meetings/conventions.~~ Presenting or attending seminars meeting the criteria of Section 15-11-6, in-house courses, workshops, or professional or technical presentations made at meetings, conventions, or conferences.
- (5) ~~Active membership in a Professional/Technical organization serving the Land Surveyor Profession.~~ participation in professional or technical societies serving the engineering or land surveying profession.
- (6) Teaching or instructing in (1) through (4) of this subsection.
- (7) Authoring published papers, articles and books.
- (8) Award of patents to the registrant or to registrant's employer when

developed by the registrant.

- (b) All such PDH's units earned in activities as described in (a)(1) through (a)(6) of this section must be relevant to the practice of engineering and/or land surveying as applicable and may include technical, ethical or managerial content.
- (c) The first biennial renewal period that a Professional Engineer must comply with this Subchapter and secure the required PDH units shall be the biennial renewal period commencing July 1, 2002. All renewals after July 1, 2004 shall comply with the rules of this Subchapter. PDH units will be allowed for the initial biennial renewal period which were earned as early as January 1, 2002. Subsequently, all PDH units must be earned within the biennial renewal period.

### 245:15-11-6. Criteria for continuing educational activities

(a) Continuing educational activities used to earn PDH's must meet the following criteria:

- (1) There is a clear purpose and objective for each activity, which will maintain, improve or expand skills and knowledge obtained prior to initial licensure or to develop new and relevant skills and knowledge.
- (2) The content of each presentation is well organized and presented in a sequential manner.
- (3) There is evidence of preplanning which should include the opportunity for input by the target group to be served.
- (4) The presentation will be made by persons who are well qualified by education or experience.
- (5) There is a provision for individual participant registration which will include information required for record keeping and reporting.

(b) The Board has final authority with respect to acceptability of courses, credit, PDH value for courses, and other methods of earning credit.

- (1) Credit for college or community college approved courses will be based upon course credit established by the college.
- (2) Credit for qualifying seminars and workshops will be based on one PDH unit for each hour of attendance.  
Attendance at qualifying programs presented at professional and/or technical society meetings will earn PDH units for the actual time of each program.
- (3) Credit determination for activities referenced in 245:15-11-5 (a)(6) and (a)(7) is the responsibilities of the registrant (subject to review as required by the board).
- (4) Credit for active participation in a professional and technical society serving the engineering or land surveying profession (limited to 2 PDH units per renewal period), requires that a licensee serve as an officer and/or actively participates in a committee of the organization. PDH credits are not earned until the end of each year of service is completed.

- (1) One (1) college or unit semester hour – 15 PDH
- (2) Auditing of (1) college or unit semester hour -15 PDH
- (3) One (1) continuing education unit - 10 PDH
- (4) One (1) hour of technical or professional development in course work, seminars, technical and professional meetings, conventions, workshops, - 1 PDH
- (5) For teaching or making presentations - apply multiple of 2\*
- (6) Each Professional/Technical paper or article -10 PDH
- (7) ~~Membership in recognized Professional/ Technical Organizations~~ Active participation in a professional and technical society. (maximum of 2 PDH per biennial renewal period) = + 2 PDH
- (8) Each patent. – 10 PDH

\*Teaching credit is valid for teaching a course or seminar for the first time only.

**245:15-11-8. Reciprocity Comity/Out-of-Jurisdiction Resident**

Continuing education requirements may be met if a registrant resides in another state which is listed by the Oklahoma Board as having a continuing educational requirements acceptable to the Oklahoma Board and the registrant certifies that all continuing educational and registration requirements for that state have been met. The CPC requirements for Oklahoma will be satisfied when a non-resident certifies licensure in and satisfaction of the mandatory CPC requirements of any jurisdiction approved

and listed by this board.

**245:15-11-9. Records**

(a) Each registrant is charged with the responsibility of his own professional development activities. The responsibility of maintaining records to be used to support credits claimed is the responsibility of the registrant. Records required include, but are not limited to:

- (1) A log showing the type of activity claimed, sponsoring organization, location, duration, instructor’s or speaker’s name, and PDH credits earned.
  - (2) Attendance verification records in the form of completion certificates, paid receipts or other documentation supporting evidence of attendance.
  - (3) Records as maintained by the professional Development Registry for Engineers and Surveyors (PDRES) or other similar repositories.
- (b) Records must be maintained for a period of three (3) years and copies may be requested by the Board for audit verification purposes.

**245:15-11-12. Reinstatement [NEW]**

A registrant may bring an inactive license to active status by obtaining all delinquent PDH units. However, if the total number required to become current exceeds 30, then 30 shall be the maximum number required.

**245:15-11-13. Dual Registrants [NEW]**

For a registrant licensed as both an engineer and surveyor, the number of PDH units required shall remain 30 per biennial renewal period, at least 1/3 of which shall be obtained in each profession.

**EXPIRATION/REVOICATION** - Certificates may be revoked by the Board for non-payment of renewal fees. Registrants will be notified of revocation by certified mail.\*

**RENEWALS** - Each registration issued by the Board expires on the last day of the month in which renewal fees are due, and becomes invalid on that date unless paid. One notice of renewal is sent by first class mail to the address of record in the board files.\*\*

**REINSTATEMENT** - Former registrants whose certificates have expired and were revoked for failure to pay renewal fees and desire to reinstate shall make application for reinstatement within 90 days after expiration and pay the prescribed renewal fee and penalty. After 90 days, a new application will be required, which shall be considered specifically by the Board, both from the standpoint of competency and of character.
