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STUDENT OUTREACH PROGRAMS AN ON-GOING SUCCESS

The Oklahoma Engineering Foundation and the Oklahoma State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors have joined efforts to present a "Student Outreach Program" to engineering students at the five ABET accredited Oklahoma universities. Since the inception of this program in October of 2000, programs have been presented to students at Oklahoma State University, Oral Roberts University, Oklahoma Christian University, and most recently at the University of Tulsa. A program is scheduled for the University of Oklahoma in the near future.

The program is designed to educate students as to the benefits of taking the Fundamentals of Engineering examination as soon as they are eligible (90 hours towards their degree) and to complete the registration process when they obtain the required years of experience following their degree. Typically, the hour-long program begins with an introduction as to who the Board is and what function it serves, followed by a power-point presentation and short video which was prepared by the National Society of Professional Engineers entitled "Get Licensed – Get Ahead". Following this presentation the Board staff speaks on the topic of the Fundamentals of Engineering Examination content and shows the students where on the website they are able to apply for the examination. The program closes with a representative from one of the sponsoring professional societies, encouraging the students to become involved in their professional and technical societies. Time is allowed for questions and answers following the presentations.

THE PASSING OF AN ERA

E. D. (Ernie) Hill, Jr., P.E., P.L.S., Oklahoma County's last County Surveyor passed away on September 21, 2002 at the age of 77.

After serving in the Air Force as a radar observer, navigator, bombardier, pilot, and installations engineer, Ernie Hill, Jr. joined his father's engineering and land surveying firm in Oklahoma City. Ernie was elected County Surveyor for Oklahoma County in 1956, an elected position that his father E.D Hill Sr. held for 18 years, and served in that position for 26 years until the office was abolished in the county reorganization of 1983.

During his tenure as County Surveyor he was instrumental in the establishment of Oklahoma's land surveyor registration law. Mr. Hill was a founding member of the Oklahoma Society of Land Surveyors, recognized as a Fellow in the American Congress on Surveying and Mapping, a member of the National Society of Professional Engineers and an active contributor to professional and civic affairs.

Mr. Hill trained and inspired many young engineers and land surveyors who continue his professional legacy. Though his presence will be greatly missed by his family and many friends, the marks he made on the land will be enduring.

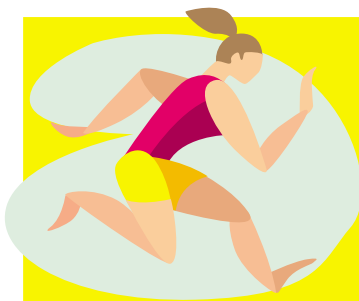

November 21-22

Exam Dates & Cut-off Dates for submitting applications:

January 3, 2003 - cut-off date for accepting P.E. and L.S. applications for the April 11, 2003 exams.

February 15, 2003 - cut-off date for accepting E.I. and L.S.I. applications for the April 12, 2003 exams

August 3, 2003 - cut-off date for accepting P.E. and L.S. applications for the October 24, 2003 exams.

Sept. 15, 2003 - cut-off date for accepting E.I. and L.S.I. applications for the October 25, 2003 exams.

License Expirations June 1, 2002 to August 31, 2002

EXPIRATION/REVOICATION - Certificates may be revoked by the Board for non-payment of renewal fees. Registrants will be notified of revocation by certified mail.*

RENEWALS - Each registration issued by the Board expires on the last day of the month in which renewal fees are due, and becomes invalid on that date unless paid. One notice of renewal is sent by first class mail to the address of record in the board files.**

REINSTATEMENT - Former registrants whose certificates have expired and were revoked for failure to pay renewal fees and desire to reinstate shall make application for reinstatement within 90 days after expiration and pay the prescribed renewal fee and penalty. After 90 days, a new application will be required, which shall be considered specifically by the Board, both from the standpoint of competency and of character.

*By practice, this notification is mailed 10 days following expiration.

**In effect, provides notice two months prior to revocation.

DISCIPLINARY ACTIVITY

September 4-6, 2002

In the Matter of Terry Stambeck, P.L.S. 1397, Case No. 02-22 At the July 11-12, 2002 Board Meeting, the Board issued a final order regarding Terry Stambeck, which appeared in the Summer 2002 Board's Bulletin. For violation of the Corner Perpetuation and Filing Act and violating the terms of probation issued in a previous case, Mr. Stambeck was ordered to appear before the Board at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board to show cause why his license to practice surveying should not be suspended or revoked because of these further violations." At the September 6, 2002 Board Meeting, the Board ordered as follows: "Mr. Stambeck is **SUSPENDED** from the practice of land surveying for a period of one year from this date. After the term of suspension Mr. Stambeck's registration will be reinstated upon his proof of compliance with the following conditions:

- A. He must satisfactorily complete the OLS Exam.
- B. He must complete attendance at a Minimum Standards seminar of the OSLS.
- C. He must show successful completion of the continuing education requirements for Land Surveyors within the period of suspension with no deficiencies.

In the Matter of Thermal Engineering Company, Case No. 02-21, Through Consent: For representing itself as an "engineering" company without a certificate of authorization, Thermal Engineering Company is assessed an administrative penalty in the amount of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) and ordered to cease and desist from this improper representation until such time as it has a certificate of authorization.

In the Matter of Edward D. Collins, P.E. 18966, Case No. 02-29, Through Consent: For practicing a discipline of professional engineering in which the Nevada board had not qualified him and for stamping plans for which he did not have responsible charge and failing to sign and date his stamp on the plans, Mr. Collins signed a Stipulated Agreement with the State of Nevada. Because these violations constitute violations of the Oklahoma statutes and rules, Mr. Collins is hereby Reprimanded.

In the Matter of James C. Lookabaugh, PLS 269 and Lake Texoma Land Surveying Co., CA 2669, Case No. 01-28, Summary of Finding of Fact and Order: Through a rehearing of the March 14, 2002, original hearing, the Board ruled as follows: Respondents are found guilty in regards to a survey for failing to conduct the proper research and investigation as required by the Oklahoma Minimum Standards for the Practice of Land Surveying (OMSPLS), failing to reference existing corner monuments within a subdivision as required by the OMSPLS, failing to show evidence of a conflict in the monumentation as required by the OMSPLS, and failing to provide measurements for the error of closure within the accuracy allowed by Section (D)(13) in the OMSPLS. Further, in reference to 3 other surveys, Respondents failed to file the required corner filings for corners established by the survey with the Archives and Records Division of the ODOL in violation of the Corner Perpetuation and Filing Act. Mr. Lookabaugh's actions by means of his repeated failure to comply with the Corner Perpetuation and Filing Act is found guilty of gross negligence. Further, Mr. Lookabaugh claimed continuing education credits improperly for the renewal period of 1998 and 2000. Therefore Mr Lookabaugh is found guilty of misrepresentation in renewing a certificate of registration in violation of Board Statutes and Rules.

Mr. Lookabaugh is assessed an administrative penalty of \$2,000. The Certificate of Registration No. LS 269 of James C. Lookabaugh is hereby Suspended until such time as this Board orders the suspension removed upon satisfactory completion of the following terms and conditions:

1. Mr. Lookabaugh shall immediately cease and desist from any and all land surveying activities within the State of Oklahoma until such time as his certificate of registration has been removed from suspension;
2. Payment of the administrative penalty;
3. Provide proof of completion of deficiency in continuing education hours to bring him current;
4. Attend the OMSPLS continuing education class;
5. Sit for and pass the OLS examination.

The Certificate of Authorization for Lake Texoma Land Surveying Company is also suspended.

FOR NON-EXEMPT REGISTRANTS:

- To complete the bottom section of the form, list your activities in the space provided using as many blocks as required. If additional space is needed, duplicate this section with your registration number.
- Under the column, Dates of Activity, please furnish date or beginning and ending dates of courses, seminars, etc.
- The name of the sponsoring organization must be provided as well as the location where the instruction or class was held. For classes that are part of a college curriculum, please list class number.
- It is important that sufficient name and/or description be given to identify that the activity relates to engineering and/or land surveying as appropriate, including the presenter's name.
- PDH's claimed for credit should be placed in the appropriate column.
- Add the credits and enter the total in the space for Total PDH's (this report). The Total PDH - Prior Year Carryover will be listed on the attached renewal card. The maximum carryover is 15 PDH's. Total PDH's is the Total PDH's for this report plus the Total PDH's Prior Year Carryover. Total PDH's Carryover to Next Renewal is the required 30 PDH's less the Total PDH's. Please remember the maximum carryover is 15 PDH.
- The last line should be filled out, signed and your Oklahoma PE and/or PLS registration number(s) listed.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR DUAL REGISTRANTS: (OAC 245:15-11-13) For an individual registered both as an engineer and surveyor, the number of PDH's required shall remain 30 per biennial renewal period, at least 1/3 of which shall be obtained in each profession. For the Dual Registrant who is exempt from continuing education requirements for one profession, but has practiced the other profession, the number of PDH's required shall remain 30 per biennial renewal period, all of which shall be obtained in the profession for which they are not exempt.

No other documentation is required at this time.

The Board will audit a selected percentage of all renewals to ensure compliance with continuing education requirements. If your name is selected for audit, you will be contacted to provide the necessary documentation. **This documentation may include, but is not limited to, letters or certificates with authorized signatures, setting forth the hours and dates of attendance.** All records of attendance and completion of PDH credits should be maintained for five years for audit purposes.

General Requirements for Activities

- All activities for which PDH's are claimed must be relevant to the practice of engineering and/or land surveying respectively and may include technical, ethical, or managerial content. These activities should advance the professional or technical competence of the registrant.
- Qualifying continuing education activities may be sponsored or presented by colleges or universities, by employers, by government agencies, by nationally affiliated land surveying or engineering technical or professional societies, or by other organizations. The board does not have a list of pre-approved sponsors.
- Qualifying activities to meet Oklahoma's continuing education requirement can be earned in any jurisdiction.
