FROM THE BOARD OF ARCHITECTS:

The spring 2006 legislative session proved very active for the Board of Architects and Landscape Architects. SB 1991 and HB 2379 brought about changes to "building types" and the addition to the Interior Designers. The Board is now officially known as "The Board of Governors of the Licensed Architects, Landscape Architects and Interior Designers of Oklahoma". The new law was signed by the Governor, and effective July 1, 2006. The Interior Designer portion of the law will go into effect, next summer, specifically, July 1, 2007. Copies of the new law, which is titled the "Oklahoma Architectural and Interior Designers Act" are now available and have been mailed to all Oklahoma registered architects and landscape architects. A corrected copy of this law is available on the website at www.boa.ok.gov. The main corrections are in Section 46.21b. We are advising everyone to read this new "Act" thoroughly noting that there are significant changes. It is important to keep in mind that the new building codes are based on the IBC (International Building Code) handbook. Of course, there are more changes on the way as the Board will be promulgating the new "Rules" this next year.

Another noticeable change is that there is a new seat on the Board. If you are interested in serving the public in this capacity we encourage you to apply directly with the Governor's Office. Appointment applications are now available on the website www.governor.state.ok.us/appoint_app.php.

On a sad note, we regret to inform you that on May 5, 2006 our Board member Mr. Harold A. Hite passed away. Harold's service on the Board began in January of 1999. He was a great person, who respected life and lived it abundantly. Harold will be greatly missed.

License Expirations March 1, 2006 to May 31, 2006

EXPIRATION/REVOCATION - Licenses may be revoked by the Board for non-payment of renewal fees. Licensees will be notified of revocation by certified mail. Typically this notification is mailed 10 days following expiration.

RENEWALS - Each license issued by the Board expires on the last day of the month in which renewal fees are due, and becomes invalid on that date unless paid. One notice of the renewal is sent by first class mail to the address of record in the board files. This in effect provides notice two months prior to revocation.

REINSTATEMENT - Former licensees whose certificates have expired and were revoked for failure to pay renewal fees and desire to reinstate shall make application for reinstatement within 180 days after expiration and pay the prescribed renewal fee and penalty. After 180 days, a new application will be required, which shall be considered specifically by the Board, both from the standpoint of competency and of character.

SURVEYING NEWS UPDATE

ATTENTION ALL CIVIL/SURVEYING FIRMS: New Land Surveyor Education Requirements In Effect

November 1, 2005, began a new era for the land surveying profession in Okla homa. While there are allowances for individuals who are already working towards their nine years of experience to apply under "Long Established Practice", those who are just entering the land surveying profession on the ground floor will be required to have a 2-year degree as a step towards licensure.

As a practicing professional land surveyor, it is important that you communicate this change in the law to anyone you have working with you, or that you are in contact with, that this change may effect. It is important that those who are just starting out working on crews, in the field, for governmental agencies such as ODOT, understand that they need to begin their education if their goal is to eventually become a licensed surveyor. The future of the profession of land surveying in Oklahoma will depend on this information getting to these individuals as quickly as possible. The Board is currently working with different universities in the state to ensure that educational programs are available. Currently there are programs at OSU-OKC, Tulsa Community College, OSU-Okmulgee, and East Central - Ada, which will get students started on the right educational path. Many of these universities offer evening classes, and distance learning to allow students to work and go to school simultaneously. The Board is developing a list of curriculum that will be "approved" for a 2-year degree program. Until surveying programs in Oklahoma become ABET accredited, this list of curriculum will act as the "approval" process for degree programs.

The Board is planning a campaign, working in cooperation with OSLS, to help get the word out to new individuals just entering the arena of surveying. We hope you will do your part as well! 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ALONG THE PATH TO COMPLIANCE By Bruce Pitts, P.L.S., Director of Enforcement

Who Are We?

International competition, increased specialization of services and the instant transfer of information are clearly changing the businesses of engineering and surveying. Creating and working with design teams and joint partnerships with other specialists is rapidly becoming the preferred method of business for successful practitioners. Client demands for "Value Engineering" and team members without knowledge of our rules of professional conduct place more pressure on us to perform more efficiently and sometimes with less control than ever before. Regardless of client pressure and whether our new partners are in the office next door, Bangladesh or Bokchito, as licensees we must still be faithful to our mission of protecting the public by exercising direct supervision and control over our projects and then correctly identifying the work for which we are responsible.

The enforcement section of this office routinely sees plans where the identity of responsible licensee or firm is not clearly shown. Sometimes the plans just bear the title block of the prime professional, or even owner or broker, along with the signature and seal of the licensee. It is not clear whom the individual engineer works for and there is no contact information provided, other than that of the prime/owner/ broker. This is a violation of Board rules and statutes, which have just been revised to expand and clarify what information must be shown.

Individuals not practicing as firms are now required to not only sign and seal the work they are responsible for, but now must include their address and telephone number on their work. That way it is clear to all users that the licensee is practicing as an individual and is not an employee of the entity appearing on the title block. Not included in the text of the rule, but a good practice would be to add the words: *Electrical Engineering by...or Land Surveying by....*

In the case of practice by a firm, the firm's name, the firm's Certificate of Authorization number and the renewal date of the Certificate of Authorization must appear on the documents. It is perfectly acceptable for the prime or other entity to include their name in the title block; however, it is mandatory that the responsible charge engineering firm's information also be included.

The Minimum Standards for the Practice of Land Surveying, adopted in 1992, require all land surveyors to include their identification on their surveys. However, this Board has seen violations when land surveyors submit electronic survey data to prime professionals who remove the surveyor's identity on the final plans. The identity of the responsible professional must be shown on the plans.

Finally, when plans are submitted to the user, whether client, prime professional or public agency, they must be signed and sealed by the licensee unless they are preliminary. In that case they will bear a note that states, "*This document is preliminary in nature and is not a final, signed and sealed document*." It is a violation for plans to be submitted for approval by any authority or for the bidding process unless they are signed and sealed or noted as above.

Letting the world know who we are and who is the responsible party is a simple yet necessary process. Identifying ourselves on our work product is a professional act and is required by statute for the protection of the public.



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Disciplinary Activity of the Board

May 4-5, 2006

In the Matter of Brett Alan Biesemeyer, P.E. 15023 and RMK Engineering, Inc., Case No. 2005-44; the Board Amended the Final Order of February 27, 2006, to include underlined text; Summary of Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law: Biesemeyer is found Guilty of undertaking an assignment outside of his area of expertise; signing and sealing plans that deal with a subject matter in which he lacks competence; misconduct by showing disregard or neglect in failing to comply with the applicable rules, codes, and recognized standards; and gross negligence because he failed to engage an architect and other qualified engineering consultants to provide the plans for the areas in which he lacks competence. Biesemeyer is assessed an administrative penalty in the amount of \$5,000.00 and ordered to cease and desist the practice of mechanical engineering in the design of buildings in the areas of HVAC and plumbing or any areas in which Brett Biesemeyer is not qualified by education and experience and electrical engineering until such time that he can demonstrate to the Board's satisfaction that he is competent to practice in those areas. Further, he is put on probation for the practice of structural engineering of buildings for two years. As a condition of probation Mr. Biesemeyer must complete the Intermediate Studies in Engineering Ethics Course. RMK is found Guilty of undertaking an assignment outside its area of expertise; issuing plans that deal with subject matters in which it lacks competence; misconduct by showing disregard or neglect in complying with the applicable rules, codes, and recognized standards; and gross negligence because it failed to engage an architect and other qualified engineering consultants to provide the plans for the areas in which it lacked competence. RMK is assessed an administrative penalty in the amount of \$1,000.00.

In the Matter of D. Hicks Consulting, CA 4882 and Darrell Hicks, PE 22055; Case No. 2005-78; Summary of Facts and Conclusions of Law: D. Hicks Consulting and Darrell Hicks are found Guilty of offering and practicing engineering in the state of Oklahoma without proper licensing.

In the Matter of Tucker-Jones Engineers Associated, P.C., CA 4866 and G. Barry Jones, PE 22036; Case No. 2005-81; Through Consent: For offering and practicing engineering in the state of Oklahoma without a certificate of authorization, Tucker-Jones Engineers Associated is found Guilty, hereby Reprimanded, and assessed an administrative penalty of \$500. For performing engineering services in the state of Oklahoma without a license to do so, G. Barry Jones is found Guilty, hereby Reprimanded and assessed an administrative penalty of \$500.

In the Matter of Iteris, Inc., CA 4905 and Lonnie J. Burklund, Case No. 2006-07;

Through Consent: Iteris, for offering and practicing engineering in the state of Oklahoma without a certificate of authorization issued by the Board, is found Guilty and assessed an administrative penalty of \$500. Lonnie J. Burkland, for offering and practicing engineering in the state of Oklahoma without a certificate of licensure, is found Guilty and assessed an administrative penalty of \$500.

In the Matter of Grossman and Keith Engineering Co., CA 74 and Wallace W. Wilson, PE 7353; Case No. 2006-19; Through Consent: Grossman and Keith, for permitting one of its employees to tender, or by tendering to a client, engineering work performed by a licensed professional engineer that was not signed and sealed by the professional engineer and for failing to affix the requisite information concerning the firm's certificate of authorization to the plans, is found Guilty and assessed an administrative penalty of \$500. Wilson, for providing to a client engineering work performed by a professional engineer that was not signed and sealed, is found Guilty and assessed an administrative penalty of \$500.

In the Matter of Ambler Architects and William D. Armstrong, PE 7070; Case No. 2005-75; Through Consent: Ambler Architects, for offering and performing engineering services in the state of Oklahoma without a certificate of authorization to do so, is found Guilty and assessed an administrative penalty of \$1,000. William D. Armstrong, PE, for signing and sealing plans for Ambler Architects when he knew or should have known Ambler Architects did not have a certificate of authorization to provide engineering services, aided and assisted Ambler Architects in the practice of engineering, is found Guilty and assessed an administrative penalty of \$500.

In the Matter of CIVE Design Group, LP, CA 4928 and Steven E. Williams, PE 20623; Case No. 2006-08; Through Consent: CIVE, for offering and performing engineering services on several projects without a certificate of authorization to do so, is found Guilty and assessed an administrative penalty of \$3,500. Steve E. Williams, for aiding and abetting the unlicensed practice of engineering services by CIVE for several projects, is found Guilty and assessed an administrative penalty of \$1,750.

In the Matter of Wozencraft Mowery & Associates and Wallace O. Wozencraft, PE 6849; Case No. 2006-09; Through Consent: Wozencraft Mowery, for offering and performing engineering services on several projects without a certificate of authorization, is found Guilty and assessed an administrative penalty of \$3,500. Wallace Wozencraft, for aiding and assisting in the unlicensed practice of engineering services by Wozencraft Mowery for several projects, is found Guilty and assessed an administrative penalty of \$1,250.

In the Matter of Focused Design/Build Solutions, LLC and William E. Kleppinger, PE 20525; Case No. 2006-11; Through Consent: Focused Design/Build Solutions, for performing engineering services in the state of Oklahoma on a project without a certificate of authorization to do so, is found Guilty and assessed an administrative penalty of \$250. William E. Kleppinger, for signing and sealing plans for a project for Focused Design/Build Solutions when he knew, or should have known the firm did not have a certificate of authorization to provide engineering services, aided and assisted in the unlicensed practice of engineering services and is found Guilty and assessed an administrative penalty of \$250. Focused Design/Build Solutions, Inc. is hereby ordered to Cease and Desist from practicing or offering to practice engineering in the state of Oklahoma until such time as it obtains a certificate of authorization to do so.

Disciplinary Activity of the Board (cont.)

In the Matter of Joe R. Crews, Architects and Joe R. Crews; Case No. 2006-28; Through Consent: Joe R. Crews Architects, for offering and performing engineering services on a project in the state of Oklahoma without a certificate of authorization is found Guilty and assessed an administrative penalty of \$500. Joe R. Crews, for offering and performing engineering services on a project in the state of Oklahoma without a license to do so is found Guilty and assessed an administrative penalty of \$500. Joe R. Crews, whether individually or as Joe R. Crews, Architects, or as a part of any other association or affiliation, is ordered to Cease and Desist from practicing or offering to practice engineering in the state of Oklahoma until such time as he has been issued a license to practice engineering in accordance with the laws of the state of Oklahoma.

In the Matter of D. R. Griffin, PLS 201 and D & C Inc. of Wyoming dba D & C Inc., CA 3696; Case No. 2006-31: Through Agreement: D. R. Griffin and D & C Inc. of Wyoming dba D & C, Inc. surrendered their licenses to practice land surveying in the state of Oklahoma in lieu of an administrative action in accord with the provision of Title 59, 475.20(B)(3) that provides that they will be permanently barred from reissuance of licensure as a professional land surveyor or professional land surveying firm in the state of Oklahoma.

In the Matter of Gary Don Rayner, PLS 1222; Case No. 2006-35: Through Consent: For numerous violations of the Corner Perpetuation and Filing Act, Rayner is found Guilty and assessed an administrative penalty of \$2,500. Rayner warrants that all corner records required to be filed have or will be filed within a defined time period.
