## Pardon and Parole Board Information and 74 O.S. § 3106.4 Compliance

Pursuant to 74 O.S. § 3106.4, the Oklahoma Pardon and Parole Board (PPB) gives notice of the following: The PPB collects personally identifiable data supplied by persons who apply for pardons, commutations, parole, or clemency consideration.

"Personally-identifiable data" is defined at 74 O.S. § 3106.4 as information that can identify an individual including, but not limited to, name, birth date, place of birth, mother's maiden name, biometric records, Social Security number, official state- or government-issued driver license or identification number, alien registration number, government passport number, employer or taxpayer-identification number or any other information that is linked or linkable to an individual, such as medical, educational, financial or employment information.

The data the PPB collects includes inmate and/or applicant information such as name, aliases, date of birth, social security number, driver's license number, Department of Correction number, sentencing information, medical information, educational information, financial, and employment information.

Such personally identifiable data is stored electronically in a secure and encrypted database, and physical records of such information are stored securely in compliance with the State's Consolidated General Records Disposition Schedule.

The Pardon and Parole Board shares necessary inmate and applicant information with Stage agencies including the Oklahoma Department of Corrections, the office of the Governor, the District Courts, District Attorneys, and Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigations to the extent required and/or permitted by law, authorized by the inmate and/or applicant, and/or necessary to carry out the PPB's functions.
