

Statewide fall enrollment count from the annual Oklahoma Public School Applications for Accreditation in selected years



2009 Oklahoma Demographics






Preliminary October 2009 Enrollment by Ethnicity




A1-2 Homeless Student Population Oklahoma Public Schools

NAEP Mathematics Average Scale Scores, 2009


Minority and Low-Income Students, Oklahoma & National with Change from 2005





Oklahoma, U.S. Average ACT Scores for Minority Groups




AP Tests: Percentage Increase in Number of 3, 4 and 5 Scores

October Enrollment: Pre-Kindergarten


