

February "4-C" Summary

The County Computer Coordination Committee (4-C) met Tuesday, February 12 at the Biltmore Hotel prior to the start of the CODA Winter Conference.

The main topic of discussion focused on how to better inform county assessors and deputies of current work items being reviewed by the group and decisions made by 4-C members.

In addition to discussion among state CAMA/AA software counties when abstract changes are needed or legislation requires additional computer programming, the group stressed the importance of also notifying and involving the other appraisal software counties of meetings and agenda items that might affect their individual software programs.

It was suggested by Association President Todd Mathes that a brief meeting summary be placed in the *Ad Valorem Forum* each month to inform each county of the items discussed and any action taken. This February 4-C meeting summary is the first attempt to accomplish this enhanced communication request.

Additionally, the group asked the Ad Valorem Division to send monthly agendas and meeting notices to the user group chair and/or others among the various CAMA software types in the state. The Ad Valorem Division will begin to send these notices starting in March.

As a regular part of each 4-C meeting, both SA&I and the Ad Valorem Division gave brief updates on their software programs to the group. The Ad Valorem Division will arrange the meeting so that general topics of interest to most counties will be put on the agenda first. This will allow people to leave the meeting rather than listen to AA/CAMA issues not relevant to their counties.
