I. Next meeting date

The next meeting will be held Tuesday, March 9 at 10:00 a.m. in the Ad Valorem Division.

II. Status Report on CAMA Windows; Status Report on AA Windows

Glen Blood reported there are no major problems. Bill Wadsworth is still waiting to hear about a settlement with MicroFocus regarding the licensing. Glen sent the future year update to Scott Warren and asked Scott's opinion of it. Scott said it sounds like it is going to work and that it is a simple way to do it. Cimarron County used it. Glen will send a list to Scott of counties that will be using it. When the Microfocus issue is settled, it will be really simple to use, and Glen explained how it would work.

Scott Warren reported the AA update is done and was used in Kay, Noble and Marshall Counties. Scott said the updates are on the web but it can also be explained by telephone to talk the assessors through the process. Scott looked at the Picture Manager program Troy was working on and has changed how to get to that; the issues should be resolved. Scott has not had time yet to look at the viewers. Joe reminded the chair, Debbie Collins, that Troy will be doing a demo at the March 4C meeting.

Debbie said she misunderstood the recent CCAP bulletin thinking it referred only to future year, not the 5%. Scott said they could send out another bulletin quickly to clarify the wording.

CCAP is doing a webinar next week. The committee recommended it be held on February 18 at 1:30 p.m. If unable to get on the event live, it will be on the website and available to download. OTC has a firewall which prevents watching it live. It's hoped that the OTC IT department can fix this issue.

III. Current County Hardware, Software Issues Related to AA and CAMA

Johnny Caldwell reported that Haskell, LeFlore, Adair, Choctaw and Latimer Counties had corrupt files caused by cabling issues. CCAP has told some of the counties who to contact to get the cabling done. They need CAT6 cabling. Scott added that counties need to be sure they have battery backups that are working. Be sure the switch is turned on. Power surges can occur from weather conditions such as ice or electrical storms. Be careful who runs the cable and where they run it. It cannot be laid across light fixtures, etc.

Teresa Strawther reported her section is almost through entering the county tax roll abstracts and putting a list together of the ad valorem reference numbers that changed, mainly due to new TIF districts and Fire Protection Districts, etc. There are changes in the numbers every year because of new districts being added, annexations, etc. The list should be done by the end of this February or sooner. They will be mailed to Carol Bomhoff when completed

Jim Kelley brought a field card that has a thumb nail photo on page one, and then the same photo plus others of the property appear on page 2. Can it be fixed where the thumb nail is not printed because it is a waste of ink to have 2 copies of the same photo on the print-out. Glen said he would check into it and see what can be done.
