

MARCH "4C" Meeting Summary

The County Computer Coordination Committee met on March 4 in the Ad Valorem Division Office for its monthly meeting.

Recently several counties encountered Windows security issues which resulted in a difficulty with the property record card in the state CAMA system. This has been identified and resolved. Documentation will be forthcoming from the OTC to provide better instructions for the counties to reference.

SA&I has begun putting out an update which among other items, completes the programming necessary to allow for sales data entry in the State Assessment Administration (AA) software. Currently, a couple of additional programming modifications are being completed to resolve a few remaining issues with this new capability.

When updates are made to the program in the county, the assessor must choose which way to enter sales, either through CAMA or AA. since the program cannot operate both ways. When the choice is made, programming has been done to activate the method selected. A menu drops down depending on the choice.

The committee discussed several ways to remove duplicate sales from the system. Incorrect neighborhood codes were causing system interactivity problems between CAMA and AA. Test data has been sent to the programmer to use in fixing this issue. It will be further tested before putting the duplication correction out to the counties.

The postmaster has advised that mail will be returned if it carries "-0000" as the last four digits of a 9-digit zip code. A fix for this issue is going to the counties. At some point in the future, the postmaster will require a full 9-digit zip code instead of five.
