

JUNE 4C COMMITTEE MEETING

The County Computer Coordination Committee met on June 3, 2008 in the office of the Ad Valorem Division.

Several updates have been made on the property record card and new Draw. Some problems have come up which are being addressed. For example, occasionally the name would disappear on personal property. These items are being addressed.

Regarding sales data entry and the qualification table, there is a coding concern. The category of "multi-unqualified" should go on #21 with an explanatory note. If it is put in AA that way and sent to CAMA, then the tables will match. Instead of selecting "unqualified", place it in "other" and write an explanation.

The SA&I staff gave the counties the ability to add or remove a code in either AA or CAMA to be sure they matched. A note appears on the pop-up screen that the two tables have to match. The user cannot exit until the match is completed.

A communication letter will be sent to all assessors to clarify this procedure.

It was reiterated the importance of a county deciding which way to do data entry, either in CAMA or AA, and that it keep that procedure in place. There cannot be switching back and forth between the two because it creates duplication of data and corrupts both files.

The latest AA revision is update ".23". The version loaded on the computer can be identified by going to "help", then "about", and there the version number can be found and all the changes can be seen.

Inquiry was made about ad valorem reference numbers and the frequency of change. These changes are generally reported during November/December and on Form 993s received in February.

The mapping drive is dropping occasionally, and it was recommended that the computer be turned on before turning on the printer to avoid the problem.

The company that primarily installs Linux in the counties is Neodigital.

As of June 30, the AA staff will be moving from SA&I to OSU/CLGT when the funding issues are resolved. Michelle Day, acting SA&I, sent letters to all county treasurers saying the agency would no longer be supporting their computer system.

A county was attempting to print delinquent assessments but couldn't edit the IQ file. It was suggested that it be tried on another computer. Inform the counties that if IQ isn't working, they should try access it on another computer.
