The next meeting date is July 13, 2010, at 10:00 a.m. in the Ad Valorem Division.

Glen Blood has received a sample of the New Draw screen, and it looks good. A complete report about it will be received in a few days for testing. The draw screen will now allow movement from one style to another without deleting it. It provides easy movement from one style to another and calculates the square footage, guiding you through the steps to make the changes. It provides a split screen with useful information on the right-hand side of the screen.

The OTC computer lab at the educational conference will provide the following:

- Use of the New Draw screen; how to change styles, get new square footages, how to utilize for commercial property changes. Familiarize with new split screen showing information on the right-hand side.
- When and how to use future year to get 100% values.
- IQ edit procedures with handouts.
- Review CAMA table manual.
- Dispelling fears about using CAMA to generate values.
- Using test analysis systems.

Jewette Farley will return as an instructor teaching from a caption of “In the Beginning, There Were Maps”.

An agenda profile will be provided to help the attendees determine which classes are most useful for them to attend. Scott Warren will be providing a list of teaching topics for addition to the agenda profile.

Scott listed the topics CCAP will be addressing in their sessions:

- Retouch on the timeline: What happens when and why data is necessary.
- Data Tips and Tricks: an explanation of some of the software tools.
- Future year from an AA standpoint.

- Basic information on Report Writer, how to get started and useful reports.
- TIF districts will be discussed in the Administrative Track.
- Attend session with presenter Nancy Grantham from SBOE re: new form.

Paul Bendt is working with Carter County to extract data from the RealWare software and said Carter County should be on the AA system by October. The treasurer signed with Tom Martin and is glad to be moving away from RealWare. Paul is getting the information needed to produce a tax roll in October. The process in Carter County moved very quickly from contract signing to extraction of data.

Debbie Collins told the group that Tony Mastin (Administrator of the OTC) asked that they consider carefully how to use the money OTC has provided to CCAP. He wants to be sure that it is used wisely to benefit the most assessors. Next year there may be less money, so please use this money wisely.

Debbie Collins asked Scott how the counties know if the backup sent to OSU is working. Scott explained it does a daily log to the assessors. There are 3 ways that data is backed up and all send a daily log. A report means the process is completed. While it takes a day to backup everything in a county, the daily backup is done in seconds. A nightly backup captures changes in tiny pieces and attaches to the file in Stillwater. There are 5 weekly backups and 2 monthly backups. The problem is some counties do not look at the reports. Debbie said her county looks at the report every day, prints it and keeps it in a notebook.

Johnny Caldwell asked if there was work being done on Windows, and Glen responded that progress is being made. Marsha Rayborn has some things working in Sequoyah County by going around the obstacles. The internet bloggers have been hammering on both Adobe and Windows. Adobe 811 is supposed to work on Vista but Glen had no luck with it. Marsha reported to Glen the speed in Sequoyah is still an issue. Johnny replied that Sequoyah County probably needs new cabling. Glen has visited with Grady County about a problem but it was user error. They need to get their files on backup with Stillwater.

Johnny added that part of the problem is too many people are streaming music, weather stations, etc. which slows the network system. He told that Pushmataha County recabled and also changed a switch which fixed the problem.

Jim Kelley inquired if there was any new idea about how to fix his draw screen so he can see all of it. He uses a 22" Dell monitor. Glen responded he needs to look at it and see if he can come up with a solution. Jim told that IQ in CAMA can only be edited through only one computer in his office.

Debbie said they have a problem with “editor” disappearing. They have to reinstall it. They go to “edit.com”.
