General Instructions

- Every organization shall make a return for each year. Title 68 O.S. 1991 § 2368.
- The filing date shall be the same as required by the Internal Revenue Code.
- Exempt Organizations are subject to tax on unrelated business income. Title 68 O.S. 1991 § 2359.
- Investment income of Exempt Organizations subject to Federal Excise tax is not subject to Oklahoma Income Tax; however, any income subject to Income tax under Internal Revenue Code is subject to Oklahoma Income Tax.
- Complete the Oklahoma Statement of Unrelated Business Income and attach schedule of any other taxable income.
- Total Unrelated Trade or Business Deductions includes the “specific deduction” allowed on the Federal return.
- Attach copies of applicable Form(s) 990, and supporting schedules filed with Internal Revenue Service.
- If you do not have a Federal Employers Identification number, you may obtain one by calling the Internal Revenue Service at (800) 829-4933 or visit the IRS website to obtain an FEIN online at www.irs.gov.

Donations from Refund

1 - Oklahoma Wildlife Diversity Program

The Oklahoma Wildlife Diversity Program is funded primarily by concerned Oklahomans. All donations provide for a variety of projects, including research, wildlife observation activities, such as workshops, informational brochures and posters.

2 - Veterans Affairs Capital Improvement Program

You may donate from your tax refund to help the Department of Veterans Affairs to purchase equipment and develop capital improvement projects and to acquire properties for expanding or improving existing projects.

3 - Oklahoma Breast Cancer Program

You may donate to help fund Oklahoma Breast Cancer Research. Monies donated will be forwarded to the State Department of Health.

4 - Oklahoma City Bombing Memorial Fund

You may donate to remember the victims of the April 19, 1995 bombing of the Alfred P. Murrah Federal Building. Donations will help defray the expense to construct and maintain the national memorial created to honor the victims of the bombing.

5 - Oklahoma School for the Deaf and Oklahoma School for the Blind

The Oklahoma School for the Deaf and the Oklahoma School for the Blind provide free preschool through high school education programs for children with hearing or vision disabilities. The schools also provide advice for families of infants and preschoolers and consultation statewide to help local schools meet the educational needs of their students with these disabilities.

6 - Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Trust Fund

Monies generated from donations to the Tulsa Reconciliation Education and Scholarship Trust Fund shall be used to provide scholarship awards to residents of the Tulsa Public School District, which was greatly impacted both socially and economically by the civil unrest that occurred in the City of Tulsa during 1921.

7 - Oklahoma Silver Haired Legislature Program

You may donate from your tax refund for the benefit of Oklahoma Silver Haired Legislature activities. The Oklahoma Silver Haired Legislature was created in 1981 as a forum to educate senior citizens in the legislative process and to highlight the needs of older persons to the Oklahoma State Legislature.

The Oklahoma Tax Commission is not required to give actual notice to taxpayers of changes in any state tax law.
