ORDER AMENDING TEMPORARY INJUNCTION

THIS MATTER COMES on for hearing on the parties joint motion to amend the Agree-
Temporary Injunction entered into herein by the parties on the 21st day of December 2004. The
Court, having heard the motion and examined the pleadings and being informed of the premise find
that said Temporary Injunction should be and is hereby amended to remove certain properties from
the injunction.

The Court further finds that the consent by the Plaintiffs to the amendment of said temporary injunction does not prejudice their rights to have the validity and legality of Ordinance No. 311-A determined by the Court.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the Agreed Temporary Injunction entered into by the parties on the 21st day of December 2004 is hereby amended as to allow the City of Catoosa, Oklahoma, to enforce municipal ordinance No. 311-A insofar, as it may pertain to the following described properties:

(All lands being located in Sections 19, 20, 30 and 31 Township 20 North, Range 15 East of the I. B. & M.,

and,

(All lands being located in Section 29, Township 20 North, Range 15 East of the I. B. & M., lying north and west of the north right-of-way line of the Will Rogers Turnpike as located prior to January 1, 2000.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the said Agreed Temporary Injunction entered into by the parties on the 21st day of December 2004 shall remain in full force and effect as to all other property contained therein until such time as the validity and legality of Ordinance No. 311-A can be judicially determined.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the consent to this amendment of the temporary injunction does not in any way prejudice the rights of the Plaintiff herein as to the validity and legality of Ordinance No. 311-A.


