

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE EXTENSION OF THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF PIEDMONT, OKLAHOMA, AND DESIGNATING THE AREAS OR TRACTS INCLUDED IN SUCH EXTENSION; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCE OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; PROVIDING THAT IF ANY PART OR PARTS HEREOF BE HELD INVALID OR INEFFECTIVE, THE REMAINING PORTIONS SHALL NOT BE AFFECTED; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

EMERGENCY ORDINANCE

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Piedmont, Oklahoma:

SECTION 1: That the corporate limits of the Town of Piedmont be, and the same are hereby extended to include therein the following described tract of land situate in Canadian County, Oklahoma:

SECTION 2: The Board of Trustees finds: (a) that the above described area is adjacent and contiguous to the present limits of the Town; (b) that the consent of three-fourths (3/4) of the legal voters residing on and the owners (in value) of three-fourths (3/4) of the property herein annexed have filed their Petition with the Town Clerk for the annexation of said property; (c) that notice of the filing of said Petition was given by publication in the manner provided by law; and, (d) all jurisdictional requirements for the annexation of said property have been complied with.

SECTION 3: The President of the Board of Trustees is hereby authorized and directed to cause a copy of this Ordinance, together with an accurate map of the territory annexed, duly certified by the Clerk of the Town of Piedmont, to be filed in the office of the County Clerk of Canadian County, Oklahoma, and have the same recorded therein.

SECTION 4: That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5: That if any part or parts hereof be held invalid or ineffective, the remaining portion shall not be affected.

SECTION 6: Whereas, it being immediately necessary for the preservation of the peace, health and safety of the Town of Piedmont and the inhabitants thereof that the provisions of this Ordinance be put into full force and effect, an emergency is hereby declared to exist by reason whereof, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and publication as provided by law.

NOTICE OF INTENTION OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES TO ESTABLISH
FIVE WARDS WITHIN THE TOWN OF PIEDMONT, OKLAHOMA, AND
FIX THE BOUNDARIES THEREOF.

TO THE RESIDENCE OF THE TOWN OF PIEDMONT, OKLAHOMA, GREETINGS:

Take notice that the Board of Trustees of the Town of Piedmont, Oklahoma at a special meeting to be held at the Town Hall on ~~February~~ **MARCH** 2, 1973, at 7:30 o'clock P.M., deeming it to the best interest of the Town and its inhabitants, proposes to enact an ordinance to divide the Town into five (5) wards, numbered 1 to 5, and establish the boundaries thereof as hereinafter set out. Any person interested may be present at said meeting and be heard.

For the purpose of describing the ward boundaries, when reference is made to a named street, avenue or road, it shall be assumed that said street, avenue or road continues on a straight line to the exterior limits of the Town; and the names of said streets, avenues or roads are those shown on the original plat of the Town and of the additions thereto, or are names generally used and accepted in the Town to designate certain streets.

The proposed names and boundaries of the wards are as follows:

WARD 1: Beginning on a center line of Jackson Ave. at a point 150 feet E. of E. line of 11th St.; thence W. along Jackson Ave. to 1st St; thence S. on 1st St. to Washington Ave; thence W. on Washington Ave to SE corner of Sec. 31; thence N. along E. line of Sec. 31 to NE corner thereof; thence W. along N. line of Sec. 31 - 5W. and Secs. 36, 35, 34, and 33 - 6W. to W. Town Limits; thence S. along said W. Town Limits to the S. Town Limits; thence E. along S. Town Limits to the SE. corner of Sec. 36 - 6W; thence S. along W. line of Sec. 6 - 5W. to the S. line of the Town Limits; thence E. along said S. Town Limits to the NW corner of E/2 SW/4 of Sec 5; thence S. along W. line of said E/2 of said SW/4 to the SW corner thereof; thence E. along S. Town Limits to SE corner of Sec. 5; thence N. along E. line of Sec 5 (Highway 4) to Washington Ave.; thence E. along Washington Ave. to a point 150 feet E. of the E. line of 11th St.; thence due N. to the point of beginning.

WARD 2: Beginning at the intersection of 1st St. and Washington Ave. thence N. along 1st St. to NE corner of NW/4 Sec. 20; thence W. along N. line of said NW/4 to NW corner thereof; thence N. along E. line of Secs. 18, 7, and 6 to the N. Town Limits; thence W. along N. Town Limits to W. Town Limits; thence S. along W. Town Limits; to SW corner Sec. 28 - 6W; thence E. along S. line of Secs. 28, 27, 26, 25 - 6W. and Sec. 30 - 5W. to the SE corner of Sec. 30; thence S. along E. line of Sec. 31 to Washington Ave; thence E. along center of Washington Ave to the point of beginning.

WARD 3: Beginning at the intersection of 1st St. and Edmond Rd.; thence N. along 1st St. to the S. line of Sec. 17; thence W. along said S. line to the SW corner of Sec. 17; thence due N. to the N. Town Limits; thence E. along said N. Town Limits to the E. Town Limits; thence S. along the E. Town Limits to the SE corner of Sec. 24; thence W. along S. line of Sec. 24, 23, and 22 to NW corner of the E/2 NE/4 of Sec. 27; thence S. along W. line of said E/2 NE/4 to the SW corner thereof; thence W. along S. line of NE/4 Sec. 27 to the SW corner thereof; thence S. along E. line of SW/4 Sec. 27 to SE corner thereof; thence W. along S. line of said SW/4 to SW corner thereof; thence N. along W. line of said SW/4 to NW corner thereof; thence W. along N. line of Sec. 28 to NW corner thereof; thence S. along E. line of Sec. 29 to the SE corner thereof, being Edmond Rd.; thence W. along Edmond Rd. to 1st St., being point of beginning.

WARD 4: Beginning at the center of the intersection of Highway 4 and the S. line of the Town Limits (being the SW/4 corner of Sec. 4); thence N. on Highway 4 to Washington Ave.; thence East along Washington Ave to a point 150 feet E. of E. line of 11th St.; thence due N. to center of Jackson Ave.; thence W. along Jackson Ave. to 5th St.; thence N. on 5th St. to Van Buren Ave.; thence E. on Van Buren Ave. to Highway 4; thence N. on Highway 4 to the NW corner of SW/4 Sec. 28; thence E. along N. line of SW/4 and SE/4 of Sec. 28 to NE corner of said SE/4; thence S. along E. line of said SE/4 to the SE corner thereof; thence E. along the S. line of SW/4 Sec. 27 to the SE corner thereof; thence N. along the E. line of said SW/4 to the NE corner thereof; thence E. along the S. line of the W/2 NE/4 of Sec. 27 to the SE corner thereof; thence N. along E. line of W/2 NE/4 Sec. 27 to the NE corner thereof; thence E. along the N. line of Secs. 27, 26 and 25 to the E. line of the Town Limits; thence S. along the E. Town Limits to Washington Ave.; thence W. along Washington Ave to the E. line of Sec. 4; thence S. along E. line of Sec. 4 to S. line of Town Limits; thence W. along S. line of Town Limits to center of Highway 4, being the point of beginning.

WARD 5: Beginning at the intersection of Jackson Ave. and 5th St.; thence W. along Jackson Ave. to 1st St.; thence N. along 1st St. to Edmond Rd.; thence E. along Edmond Rd. to Highway 4; thence S. along Highway 4 to Van Buren Ave.; thence W. along Van Buren Ave. to 5th St.; thence S. on 5th St. to Jackson Ave., being the point of beginning.






