**Almost \$80,000 in Unclaimed Property Found for  
Enid Home Show Attendees**

*Largest Amount Found: \$28,000 in Lost Stock for Enid Man*

**OKLAHOMA CITY** – Almost \$80,000 was found for attendees of the Enid Home Show last weekend at the Chisholm Trail Expo Center, State Treasurer Scott Meacham announced today.

A total of \$78,954 was found for 68 people who attended the show and visited the Treasurer's Unclaimed Property booth. The largest, single amount found was \$28,566 in lost stock for an Enid man.

"I'm pleased we were able to find so much money for the people who attended the show," Meacham said. "We are holding \$260 million for 350,000 Oklahomans and we want to give it back."

Meacham and his staff annually man a booth at the Enid Home Show. In addition, the treasurer and his staff conduct similar outreach at the Oklahoma City and Tulsa state fairs each year.

Meacham operates a searchable database on his office's web site, [www.treasurer.ok.gov](http://www.treasurer.ok.gov). Visitors should click on the black and gold "Search for Unclaimed Property" button near the top of the page.

Unclaimed property includes cash, rebates, paychecks, royalties, stock, bonds and safe deposit box contents.

When businesses lose track of people to whom they owe money, the law requires them to bring the property, along with the owner's name and last known address, to Treasurer Meacham's office.
