To the People of Oklahoma:

I am pleased to issue the February monthly investment performance report for the Office of the State Treasurer. I trust you will find it thorough and in keeping with my commitment to provide full and complete disclosure of all activities within my office. As always, my staff and I are available to answer any questions you might have.

Market Conditions

The long-end of the U.S. Treasury curve flattened slightly in February, with the 10-year benchmark at 2.39% and the 30-year at 2.99%. Year-to-date the 10-year Treasury yield has ranged from 2.31% to 2.51%. The two-year Treasury finished the month up 5 basis points at 1.26% and the five-year was at a 1.93%.

The end of the month marked a halt to the Dow Jones twelve-day winning streak. The Dow fell 25 points to 20,812, the S&P 500 dropped to 2,363 and the Nasdaq declined to 5,825. The index returns for the first two months of the year were positive with the Dow earning 5.3%, the S&P at 5.6% and the Nasdaq up a strong 8.2%.

The minutes of the Federal Reserve reflected a likely chance that interest rates could be increased, but no timeframe was given. The anticipation of possible policy changes from the new administration's fiscal and economic plans could affect the likelihood of quicker and more frequent rate increases. The central bank said it expected "inflation to rise to 2% over the medium term" and "measures of consumer and business sentiment have improved of late". The Fed also said they would discuss in future meetings when and how to begin reducing the central bank's large asset portfolio.

Economic Developments

The nonfarm payroll report was 227,000 for January, coming in higher than the 180,000 consensus estimate and the previous months figure was revised by 1,000 to 157,000. The unemployment rate moved slightly upward from 4.7% to 4.8%. Increasing by 0.1% in January, average hourly earnings missed the consensus estimate of 0.3% but grew by 2.5% year-over-year. The labor force participation rate reflected that some of those previously not searching for work were searching again, with an increase to 62.9% from 62.7% the month before.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics reported that January headline consumer price index (CPI) grew by 0.6% and core CPI increased by 0.3%, which was attributed to price increases in energy, utility gas service and apparel. The headline producer price index (PPI) for final demand came in at 0.6%, exceeding the economic consensus of 0.3%. This was the third consecutive month of higher headline PPI. Taking out food and energy, core PPI was reported at 0.4%.

Retail sales in the U.S. came in higher than anticipated at 0.4%, in comparison to 5.6% from a year ago. December's sales were upwardly revised from 0.6% to 1%. Excluding autos and gasoline, sales were 0.7%. Car dealerships were the only major retail sector that did not have higher sales than the previous month. Electronic and appliance sales increased by 1.6%, the highest growth in a year and a half. Sales gains were also found in clothing and sporting goods of 1% or more and department stores jumped 1.2%, reflecting the largest increase since December 2015.

Total existing-homes sales for January were reported by the National Association of Realtors (NAR) to be a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 5.69 million, from an upwardly revised 5.51 million in December. The January numbers reflected a 3.8% increase from a year ago and reflected completed transactions that included single-family homes, townhomes, condominiums and co-ops. NAR said “much of the country saw robust sales activity last month as strong hiring and improved consumer confidence at the end of last year appear to have sparked considerable interest in buying a home”.

The Commerce Department said there was a seasonally adjusted \$44.26 billion foreign-trade gap deficit for goods and services in December, reflecting a decrease of 3.2% from the month before. Imports were up 1.5% for the month, but exports increased 2.7% from November. The deficit in 2016 was 2.7% of gross domestic product (GDP), falling from 2.8% in 2015. At the highest level since 2012, the U.S. foreign-trade deficit for 2016 was \$502.25 billion.

Portfolio Commentary: Performance, Diversification, and Strategy

The Treasurer’s portfolio yielded 1.64% in February with a weighted average maturity of 869 days. The year-to-date monthly average investable base was \$3.06 billion, in comparison to \$3.71 billion a year ago. Portfolio diversification continues to be sound. U.S. Treasury Inflation-Protected Securities represented 1% of holdings, and U.S. government sponsored enterprises accounted for approximately 40% of the portfolio. Mortgage-backed securities were 37%, municipal bonds were 2% and Certificates of Deposit represented 4% of assets. Money market mutual funds were 10% and OK Invest, which is comprised of various State agency funds, represented 3% of the total portfolio. State Bond Issues (at 2%) and foreign bonds (at less than 1%) made up the balance of funds invested. In keeping with the State’s statutory investment objectives, the portfolio strategy continues to seek safety, liquidity, and return on investment, in that order. Laddered bond maturities and a buy-and-hold strategy were utilized. Market observation for investment opportunities were considered in order to maximize income within investment parameters and the current low interest rate environment.

Collateralization

All funds under the control of this office requiring collateralization were secured at rates ranging from 102% to 110%, depending on the type of investment.

Payments, Fees, and Commissions

All securities were purchased or sold on a net basis utilizing competitive bidding where practicable, with no additional fees or commissions known to the State Treasurer. Bank fees and mutual fund operating expenses are detailed in the attached pages, as is the earnings split between the Treasurer and the master custodian bank on securities lending income.

Total Funds Invested

Funds available for investment, at cost basis, include the State Treasurer’s investments at \$2,872,048,970 and State Agency balances in OK Invest at \$2,370,385,370 for a total of \$5,242,434,340.





These figures, which are dollar and time-weighted where appropriate, are calculated using the percentage change in market value (inclusive of accrued income) from the end of the prior month to the end of the reporting month.

To ensure the integrity of data, this information is provided by the Treasurer's custodian bank, acting in its capacity as an external third party. As such, performance measurement is presently confined to those investments which are held with the custodian bank Northern Trust Company.



Note: Pursuant to Oklahoma State Statute Title 62, Section 89.7, all know fees are to be reported. The money market mutual fund fees reported are shown at the contracted rate. Due to the current low interest rate environment, a portion of these fees have been voluntarily waived by the provider. An adjustment to actual fees will be presented in the Annual Report.

SECURITIES LENDING PROGRAM

The State Treasurer participates in a Securities Lending Program with Northern Trust Company acting as lending agent. Northern Trust retains 15% of the revenues generated as compensation for services, their share for the month was \$ 0.00. Pursuant to Oklahoma State Statute Title 62 Section 90, the State Treasurer retains the first 450,000.00 of Security Lendings revenues in a revolving fund. These funds are used to pay **custody and other banking fees**. Any revenue not needed for this purpose is deposited to the General Fund.

NORTHERN TRUST CUSTODY FEES

Pursuant to a custodial contract with Northern Trust Company, custody fees are paid on a quarterly basis. Fees paid to Northern Trust Company for the first and second quarters was \$23,000.
