To the People of Oklahoma:

I am pleased to issue the November monthly investment performance report for the Office of the State Treasurer. I trust you will find it thorough and in keeping with my commitment to provide full and complete disclosure of all activities within my office. As always, my staff and I are available to answer any questions you might have.

Market Conditions

In November 5-year U.S. Treasury notes finished the month at 1.37%, 10-year Treasuries ended at 2.74% and the 30-year bond yield fell from a high of 3.91% to 3.81%. The treasury yield curve was at its steepest slope in over two years. The S&P 500 closed at 1,805 with the index up nearly 27% for the year. The Dow Jones Industrial Average ended at 16,086. The NASDAQ finished at a thirteen-year high of 4,059. Comments made during the month by Mr. Bernanke, Ms. Yellen and other Federal Open Market Committee members continued to emphasize that the fed funds rate will probably not begin rising even after the unemployment rate moves below 6½%, especially if inflation remains below 2%.

Economic Developments

The nation's economy added 204,000 jobs in October, but the federal government shutdown increased the unemployment rate to 7.3%. The private sector created 212,000 jobs during the month, with production of goods creating 35,000 jobs and the service sector 177,000 jobs. Business in retail, manufacturing, hospitality and health care expanded their payrolls significantly.

The Conference Board released its Consumer Confidence Index for September, which fell to a reading of 70.4 from an upwardly revised 72.4 in October. This was the lowest reading for the headline index since May. The percentage of polled participants who reported that jobs were hard to get was 35.8% and 17.5% expected business conditions to worsen over the next six months.

The annual headline consumer price index (CPI) inflation fell to 1.0% in October, its slowest pace of increase since October 2009. Lower-than-expected energy prices attributed to most of the decline as gasoline, natural gas and fuel oil all decreased during the month. Energy prices in the CPI were down -4.8% versus a year ago. Annual inflation for core CIP remained steady at 1.7%.

The Bureau of Labor Statistics reported the Producer Price Index (PPI) for finished goods declined 0.2% in October, seasonally adjusted. Prices for finished goods fell 0.1 % in September. The decrease in the index for October was due to the 1.5% price drop in finished

energy goods. By contrast, the indexes for finished consumer foods and for finished goods less foods and energy moved up 0.8% and 0.2%, respectively.

The Commerce Department reported that retail sales for October increased 0.4% or \$428B from September and stood 3.9% higher over the trailing twelve month period. Adjusted for inflation, real retail sales advanced by 2.1% year-over-year, which was just under the 2.2% average rate for household consumption growth over the past 17 quarters. Core retail sales, less autos and gas, were 0.3% higher. Data indicates that strong gains were reflected at sporting goods/hobby stores, apparel retailers, electronic, appliance and furniture stores.

Pending home sales decreased 0.6% in October, which represented the fifth consecutive monthly decline based on contract signings. The government shutdown was a partial factor in the decline, putting would-be buyers in a holding pattern for the first half of the month. Pending home sales were 1.6% below what was reported twelve months ago. The existing inventory of homes was at an average of five month's supply. The average number of days on the market increased to 54 days, in comparison to 71 days one year before. The National Association of Realtors stated that declining affordability and limited inventory remained as detriments to any substantial rebound. Positive news was released by the Mortgage Bankers Association that the third quarter seasonally adjusted delinquency rate on residential mortgages was the lowest since 2008. Foreclosure actions were started on 0.61% of mortgages, also the lowest percentage since 2008.

The Department of Commerce reported the U.S. trade gap widened 8.0% to \$41.8B in September. Exports declined 0.2% due to sluggish global growth to \$188.9B, which marked the third consecutive monthly decrease. Imports rose 1.2% to \$230.7B which reflected their highest level since November 2012. Exports were up 1.1% from a year earlier during which imports had grown 1.0%. The Commerce Department also reported that Real GDP rose 2.8% in the third quarter. The strongest part of the report was a large rise in inventories, which added 0.8% to the headline figure.

Portfolio Commentary: Performance, Diversification, and Strategy

Yield on the Treasurer's portfolio was 1.91% in November and the weighted average maturity was 1,196 days. The year-to-date monthly average investable base was \$4.157 billion. Portfolio diversification continues to be sound. U.S. Treasury Inflation-Protected Securities represented 1% of holdings, and U.S. government sponsored enterprises accounted for approximately 42% of the portfolio. Mortgage-backed securities were 39%, municipal bonds were 2% and Certificates of Deposit represented 3% of assets. Money market mutual funds were 8%, and the allocable portion of sales and use tax to General Revenue collected by the Oklahoma Tax Commission was 3%. State Bond Issues (at 2%) and foreign bonds (at less than 1%) made up the balance of funds invested. In keeping with the State's statutory investment objectives, the portfolio strategy continues to seek safety, liquidity, and return on investment, in that order. Based on challenging and potentially volatile market conditions, portfolio strategy consists of a combination of laddered maturities and market observation for investment opportunities that will maximize income in a secure environment.

Collateralization

All funds under the control of this office requiring collateralization were secured at rates ranging from 102% to 110%, depending on the type of investment.

Payments, Fees, and Commissions

All securities were purchased or sold on a net basis utilizing competitive bidding where practicable, with no additional fees or commissions known to the State Treasurer. Bank fees and mutual fund operating expenses are detailed in the attached pages, as is the earnings split between the Treasurer and the master custodian bank on securities lending income.

Total Funds Invested

Funds available for investment, at cost basis, include the State Treasurer's investments at \$3,860,282,113 and State Agency balances in OK Invest at \$2,385,255,352 for a total of \$6,245,537,645.



In February 2013, the Treasurer estimated earnings to the Board of Equalization for Fiscal Year 2014. The amount estimated was \$86,000,000. Year-to-date actual earnings are recorded on a cash basis of accounting.

Explanation of Performance Comparison November 30, 2013

The following page presents market rates of return on the Securities portion of the General Account and of the State's aggregated State Agency Accounts. The figures, which are dollar- and time-weighted, where appropriate, are calculated using the percentage change in market value (inclusive of accrued income) from the end of the prior month to the end of the reporting month. To ensure the integrity of the data, this information is provided by the Treasurer's custodian bank acting in its capacity as an external third party. As such, performance measurement is presently confined to those investments which are custodied at J. P. Morgan Chase & Co.

The Treasurer's office is trying to develop a method to report rates of return on all investment instruments in the State's portfolio. This is in an effort to report return data in a manner recommended on September 15, 1994, by the Working Group of the Cash Management and Investment Oversight Commission. However, there are technical and conceptual challenges to expanding performance measurement to other portions of the portfolio. Attempting to apply market-base pricing calculations to instruments which do not trade, such as Certificates of Deposit, presents difficulty which is both conceptual and technical in nature.



NOTE: Pursuant to Oklahoma State Statute Title 62, Section 89.7, all known fees are to be reported. The money market mutual fund fees reported above are shown at the contracted rate. Due to the current low interest rate environment, a portion of these fees have been voluntarily waived by the provider. An adjustment to actual fees will be presented in the Annual Report.

The State Treasurer participates in a Securitiet Lending Program with J. P. Morgan Chase & Co. acting as lending agent. J. P. Morgan retains 15% of the revenues generated as compensation for services. Its share for the month was \$1,113.93. Pursuant to Oklahoma State Statute Title 62 Section 90, the State Treasurer retains the first \$450,000 of securities lending revenues in a revolving fund. These funds are used to pay custody and other banking fees. Any revenue not needed for this purpose is deposited to the General Fund.
