Strong Response Seen for Tax Rebate Address Change

OKLAHOMA CITY – More than 2,300 Oklahomans have notified the state of their new addresses as the State Treasurer’s Office prepares to mail more than 1.2 million checks to taxpayers, State Treasurer Scott Meacham announced today.

Meacham said taxpayers who have moved without leaving a forwarding order with the post office have until October 21st to notify the state of their new addresses.

“I strongly urge those who have moved to let us know of their new address by going to www.ok.gov and clicking on the Taxpayer Relief Address Change button,” he said.

“Time is running out and we want to make sure everyone who is entitled receives their taxpayer relief check without delay.”

Beginning in late November and running through mid-December, the state will mail checks to state taxpayers to distribute more than \$91 million in surplus revenue. Exact amounts have not been determined, but checks for single taxpayers will be around \$45 and checks for married couples will be around \$90.

Proposed by Governor Henry, Oklahoma Taxpayer Relief payments were authorized in the closing days of the legislative session. The money represents surplus state revenue left over after the state’s Rainy Day Fund was filled to capacity at the end of the state’s fiscal year that ended June 30, 2005.
