## 2. <u>Discussion and Consideration of Reducing the Security Deposit of AT&T</u> Corp., a Former Own Risk Employer, Permit #00325

Pursuant to Commission Rule 810:25-9-19, a security deposit posted with the Commission as required by Commission Rule 810:25-9-4 must remain in place, at its existing amount, for two years after an individual own risk employer voluntarily leaves self-insurance. A security deposit may be reduced or released

at the Commission's discretion after the two-year waiting period upon application by the employer and submission of current financial statements and workers' compensation loss runs. The Commission considered reducing the security deposit of AT&T Corp.
