

Weekly Death Benefits for Deaths Occuring During the Period of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020

The following chart represents the aggregate weekly income benefits payable to all beneficiaries of a deceased worker whose AWW equals or exceeds the SAWW of \$898.63

¹Weekly death benefits are computed as percentages of the average weekly wage of the deceased worker, **not to exceed the state's average weekly wage**. This chart is only a guide and benefit amounts may vary based upon the average weekly wage of the deceased. The Workers' Compensation Commission determined on 10/18/19 that 85A O.S. §2(24) requires that the effective date of the average weekly wage is January 1 of the year following the determination of the rate by the Oklahoma Employment Security Commission, rather than November 1 of the current year. For example, the rate for 2019 becomes effective January 1, 2019, rather than November 1, 2018.

1	Spouse Only	\$100,000
2	Spouse and one (1) child	Spouse: \$100,000 Child: \$25,000
3	Spouse and two (2) or more children	Spouse: \$100,000
		Children: \$50,000 divided equally
4	No spouse, up to two (2) children	\$25,000 per child
5	No spouse, more than two (2) children	\$25,000 per child, up to a maximum of \$150,000 divided equally
6	Spouse, upon remarriage	Two (2) years' indemnity benefit in one lump sum

¹ In all cases, the employer shall pay actual funeral expenses, not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000)
